Mildred Solberg, 97 of Stanley, ND, passed away Friday, January 17, 2020 at the Mountrail Bethel Home in Stanley.


Mildred was born on her parent's farm five miles SW of Blaisdell, ND, on June 28, 1922 to Helga and George Peterson, being the fifth of seven children.
