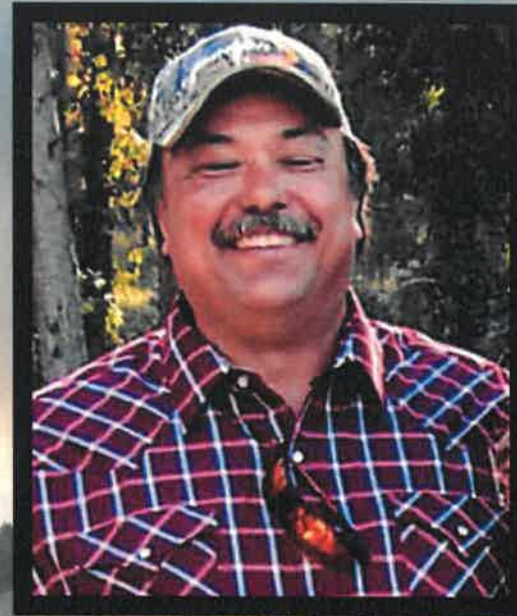


**For years, the riverbank was where
