Every fall they all had some fun getting to go to "Crazy Days" in Bemidji school shopping. And when Dana was home from the army, he and Jeff would go out rat-racing on the snowmobiles!

After he graduated high school in 1981 he went to Votech in Alexander, MN for small engine & marine. Shortly after he graduated there, he met Candy Tisland at a dance hall outside of Kelliher and the rest is history.

Jeff & Candy got married June 15, 1985, lived in MN until 1989 when they moved to Kalispell, MT not long after their daughter and first child Tasha was born in 1988. Jeff & Candy went fishing in Red Lake a lot when they first married & he taught his daughter to fish & she still loves it to this day!

When Zach was little & in boy scouts Jeff loved helping him out especially with the box car derbies and making the cars! The joy on Jeff's face when he saw how happy Zach was that he had won!
