Brian Bolinske bought the business from Jean Tande and Linda continued to work in the framing business until she bought the business from Brian in 2013. She was the sole owner and operator of Castle Framing and Gifts. Linda was a very detailed and talented framer and artist, and it showed in all the products that she created.

She was a painter of oil and watercolors and painted many paintings in her lifetime. Whether it was on canvas or other objects. She also enjoyed quilting which she inherited this from her mother. She took over the Tri-County Art & Craft after her mother passed away along with Mary Axelson to support local crafters to sell their wares.

Linda was passionate about the Williston community and was always willing to volunteer in so many ways. She was part of the Williston Downtowners Association from the beginning for almost ten years. She was a board member and a committee member. The Art and Wine walk was her specialty. She loved to showcase local artists for the event.
