Eleanor Enget, 97 of Tioga, ND formerly of Powers Lake, ND passed away on Thursday, July 20, 2023 at the Tioga Long Term Care in Tioga, ND.

Eleanor was born on May 2, 1926, the second child of Clarence and Hazel Watterud, on the family farm near Columbus, ND. Eleanor was one of five girls, having seven younger brothers. She moved to Powers Lake with her family in 1936 where she completed Secondary School. Eleanor excelled in school and with her High School diploma, she began teaching country schools.
