

When you remember me,


It means you have carried something of who I am with you, that I have left some mark of who I am on who you are.



Wade struggled with lung issues for several years and watched the love of his life Daniela, his wife of 31 years, pass away a little over a year and half ago after battling cancer. He has gone to join her and both their parents, Roy and Patricia Hartle and Leon and Raveca Sev, on the other side.
