



Denny worked over 25 years in the oilfield before he took a job for the federal government as a Rangeland Management Specialist, which he did for 10 years. He fully retired in 2016 and enjoyed retirement life. Denny loved his coffee, a good meal, trips to the casino, and memories with his family. He may not have realized how very helpful that was to all of us.

He loved being a grandfather and happily earned the nickname "Goofy Grampa". He was especially proud of being a Great Grandfather and being able to take a five-generation photo with his mother.
